First and foremost, we extend our gratitude to each of you for the opportunity afforded us to improve the direction of our Mu-Gamma Chapter. Since we got in trouble, it has been our goal to wholeheartedly exceed your expectations, and we are therefore pleased to report much progress regarding the reputation of Kappa Sigma at Texas A&M University. It is our belief that we have made strides toward realizing the finer points of what it means to be Brothers in Kappa Sigma; our commitment to the Order is stronger than ever before, and our recent accomplishments are indicative of our devotion:


- 66 of our Brothers—76% of the Chapter—have attained at least one certificate of ritual proficiency. In the short period of this summer and the beginning of this semester we raised that number from 47% by adding an additional 24 certificates of proficiency.
- Our cumulative Chapter GPA stands at 3.096—Above the All Men's Averages.
- Our Chapter has contributed 1047 total hours of community service in the past few months and we have completely redone our philanthropy program to incentivize involvement and to raise awareness of Men's mental health issues (Details on last page).
- We showed vast improvement in our Champions Quest by recruiting 30 new members this fall (Almost beating number from the entire year of 17-18, 34 new members). Keep in mind we did this while still having the social detriment of being on probation and we grew our chapter by 30%.
- We have developed an outstanding relationship with both our Alumni base and our Greek Life officials. This includes participating/volunteering at alumni programs and events such as our Mu Gamma Alumni Golf Tournament and working to set up a council for transitions in leadership.
- We have met all of the requirements asked of us due to our sanctions in a timely manner.









Percentage of Men with at least One Certificate of **Ritual Proficiency** 100 75 Percent 50 25




A Greater Cause Hours per Brother



Brothers Reaching Out

Brothers Reaching Out is the philanthropic organization for the Mu Gamma chapter of Kappa Sigma at Texas A&M University. It was established to advocate for men's mental health and support men of all ages in the Texas A&M University, College Station/Bryan communities and beyond. We seek to be an advocate and raise awareness for men's mental health issues by providing support on and off campus through various events and on campus resource tables. It also seeks to decrease the stigma around mental health problems, to better support men and increase their likelihood of seeking help.

Through this program we have been active on campus and in our community. We hosted resource tables on campus in order to raise awareness about men's mental health issues and we brought donuts to our local fire department on September 11th to show our support for very people that keep us safe from harm and we are planning an event to raise awareness of PTSD and to raise money for Military Heroes.





Mu-Gamma grows 30% and Omicron-Chi leads all other Fraternities at Nicholls State!

The Mu-Gamma Chapter at Texas A&M University just completed their most successful fall rush in recent history, and bid 30 new pledges to push the Chapter well over 110 men. The chapter was motivated this year to raise their goals higher than ever before, and worked hard to make sure they could deliver on those goals. The 30-man pledge class is a 30% increase over last fall for Mu-Gamma - and their hard work paid off!
